Point Dume home owners are said to enjoy the best private beach experience in all of Malibu. Residents here enjoy serene oceanfront living without the intrusion of road noise from Pacific Coast Highway. At night, it's not unusual to see bonfires sparking on the shoreline as friends gather for fun and relaxation.

Although most of the horses and equestrian trails of Point Dume's earlier days are gone, this Malibu community retains much of its rural flavor. Once the Malibu Colony real estate leases expired, many of its glamorous residents opted to buy their homes. The structures were then expanded in glorious celebrity style, featuring more square footage, pools, tennis courts and more.
